


Grocott's methenamine silver stain, shows septate hyphae with acute angle branching characteristic of aspergillus fumigatus.






Figure 1. Microscopic features of *A fumigatus*. (a) High-power photomicrograph demonstrates conidiophores with the characteristic head appearance and minute spores. (b) Medium-power photomicrograph shows septate hyphae branching at an angle of approximately 45°.

 Lung biopsy: tissue from central and peripheral areas of affected lung

Thoracoscopic biopsy:
 not systematically studied in children

- Radiographic : variable
- Plain chest Radiographs : non specific finding
  - Segmental consolidation
  - multilobar consolidation
  - Perihilar infiltrates
  - Pleural effusions and/or nodular lesions
  - 10 % Normal; CT scan may show lesions in patients with normal radiographs
